An Epiphany invitation to learn how to make and then pray/meditate with Anglican Prayer Beads. In the 1980’s a group of Episcopalians set out in group contemplative prayer using beads. The experience is similar to the Roman tradition of praying the rosary but unique in that there is a more meditative focus.
